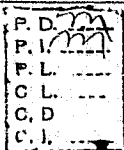

Bill of Sale

I know all men by their Primitives, That I, Robert Fisher, on this 8th day of December, 1906, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration, have bargained, sold and conveyed to Arthur R. Perryman, all of the corn belonging to me or to be delivered to me, grown during the season of 1906 on the farms of Eva L. Perryman, Walter L. Perryman and Thomas L. Perryman, whether in crib or in field.

And for the same consideration I hereby assign and sell to the said Arthur R. Perryman the stalk fields on the said farms, and for the same consideration I hereby assign to said Arthur R. Perryman all money due me for corn yet on the above mentioned farms for which I have not received payment.

Unto the said Arthur R. Perryman, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever, and I covenant with the said Arthur R. Perryman that I will gather the above mentioned corn or cause it to be gathered and piled or cribbed at such places on said farms as may be indicated by said Arthur R. Perryman, and that said Arthur R. Perryman, his agents, heirs, assigns, executors or administrators shall have the right to enter upon said lands for the purpose of preserving or removing such corn.
