Now on the 9th day of August, 1906, before me the undersigned a Notary Public within and for the District and Territory aforesaid, came John Rogers, who being by me first duly sworn did depose and say:

That he was personally acquainted with one Annie Martin, a Creek (3/4) Indian now deceased; that she was a resident of the Creek Nation, Indian Territory, and the wife of William Martin; that she received no pay or settlement, together with other lands, she had one half (1/2) of the tract and quarter (1/4) of Section 14 (1/4) of Township 14 (1/4) Range 12 (1/2) East; that on the 29th day of May 1903, she and Annie Martin did execute at Red Fork, Indian Territory, and left as her only heirs Elgie Rose, her husband, her daughter, and William Martin, her husband.
