

E. $\frac{1}{4}$ and NW. $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 33 Township 20 north Range 12 east, containing thirty acres more or less.

And the said C. Milton Latimer, further releases, quitclaims and sells for the consideration herein mentioned all of his over half interest in said land and any other interest that he may have to and unto the said Alma V. Gipson, for fees and wages.
