Warranty Deed.

Know all Men by these Presents, that we Martha Pagan and Leo N. Pagan our husband, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifteen Hundred & Fifty $\frac{1}{2}$ Dollars, to them paid cash in hand, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Nannie House, and unto her heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: Twenty-five feet of ground being a perfect Octangle fronting on Third Street extending back 100 feet and being the East end of lot 65 Block 106 & is further described as follows: Beginning at the S.E. corner of Lot 5 in Block 106 and running 100 feet along the alley line north, thence at right angle, west 25 feet, thence south 100 feet to street, thence east along Third street 25 feet to place of beginning & it is further understood that the 100 feet on the North end of this said lot shall forever remain open for a drive way for the public.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Nannie House and unto her heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereto belonging;

And hereby covenant with said purchaser that they will forever warrant and defend the title to said lands against all claims whatever, except the ten feet above reserved for drive way.

And I, Martha Pagan wife of the said Leo N. Pagan for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Nannie House all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
