

and Olia Owee, of the three fifths interest in and to the following described tract of land to-wit:

The south east quarter (1/4) of the north-west quarter (1/4) and the east one-half (1/2) of the northeast quarter (1/4) of the southeast quarter (1/4) and lot four (4) all in Section two (2) Township nine (9) north range twelve (12) east. And it appearing to this Court that the Secretary of the Interior no longer has control over the property of the minor Addie Owee Albert ^{of the Owee} ~~Tracy Owee~~ and that a commission from the Secretary of the Interior to sell the land had by the act of May 26 1906 commonly known as the Curtis act of that year become null and void.

And it appearing to the said Court that the conditions stipulated by the Court for the sale of the above described interest of the minor in the said land have been substantially complied with, and said guardian Chauncey A. Owee, appearing in Court by his attorneys Page and Waage and representing that the said land was sold as directed by the Court to C. B. Lynch as the highest bidder in the sum of twenty-seven hundred fifty dollars (\$2,750.00) and the said guardian presenting a deed from himself as guardian to the said C. B. Lynch for the said interest in the minor in the said land).

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed that the said deed attached hereto dated December 5, 1906, describing the said land, made by Chauncey A. Owee as guardian for the above minor be and the same is hereby ratified confirmed, and each and every act of the guardian in conformity to the direction of the court in the carrying out of the said sale is ratified and confirmed and the title to the said interest in the said land is hereby ratified and confirmed in the said C. B. Lynch and the sale is hereby confirmed and ratified.
