Sir: On March 27, 1906 you transmitted the petition of Mamie Sullivan a citizen by blood of the Creek Nation for permission to unrestrictedly alienate as an addition to the townsite of Tulsa, Ind. T., in accordance with the act of March 3, 1903 (32 Stat., 982) certain inherited lands described as the N.E. 1/4 of the S.W. 1/4 of the N.W. 1/4 of Section 12, T. 19, N. R. 12 E., containing acres.

This land was regularly allotted to George B. Perryman the deceased father of this applicant. This record includes the decree of the United States Court partitioning the estate of the said George B. Perryman and awarding the land herein described to the petitioner Mamie Sullivan. Tulsa is one of the largest towns in the Indian Territory with a population of 10,000 inhabitants. It is growing very rapidly and there is an urgent demand for additional townsite property.

Mamie Sullivan is a three-fourths blood Creek Indian. She is separated from her husband but is well educated and thoroughly competent to transact her own business affairs. You recommend that the petition be granted and that the applicant be permitted to sell her land in question without restriction. Reporting May 15, 1906 the Indian office concurs in your recommendation. A copy of its letter is enclosed.

It appears to be proper that this petition should be granted. The application is hereby approved and the applicant will be permitted to sell the land in question without restriction.
