 states: That he is a resident of the Western District of
 Indian Territory; that he is an attorney; that he was
 the attorney for Chauncey A. Owen of Owners of Tulsa
 Indian Territory in proceeding before the Commission to
 the Five Civilized Tribes the rights of Clarence Owen deceased
 as a Creek Citizen entitled to allotment; that at that
 time there was presented to the said Commission to the
 Five Civilized Tribes a sheet of paper which was proven
 by competent witnesses as the birth and death sheet from
 the family bible of the Owen family; that I heard the
 same, proven by competent witnesses to be a
 correct statement of the births and deaths of the
 different members of the family; that the said
 sheet showed the birth of Elva Owen now Harris
 to have occurred on the first day of March 1885 and
 that accordingly she was of the age of 18 years
 on the first day of March 1906. Further affidavit
