In the matter of the application of John Walker, a citizen by blood of the Cherokee Nation for the removal of the restrictions upon the sale of his allotment except his homestead

In accordance with the regulations approved by the Secretary of the Interior May 12, 1904 in conformity to the provisions of the act of Congress approved April 12, 1904 (33 Stat. 204) I have made a full investigation in connection with the application of John Wilkerson a citizen by blood of the Cherokee Nation for the removal of the restrictions upon the alienation of his allotment (except his homestead) described as follows; - The North-half N² of the southeast quarter - S. E. ¹/₄ of the north west quarter N. W. ¹/₄ of Section twenty (20) Township twenty-one (21), north range fourteen (14) east and the south west nine and ¹/₂ - nine one hundredths 949 - acres of Lot four (4) Section nineteen (19) Township fourteen (14) north Range twenty three (23) east of the Indian Base and meridian and as the result of that investigation, satisfied that the removal of the restrictions as to the sale of the above described lands will be for the best interest of the allottee and I so recommend. The approval of this certificate does not in any manner determine the right of the allottee to any particular tract of land.
