

and to take stone, gravel and timber and to borrow earth on said land for the construction and maintenance of said railroad. If there should be oil produced on the land herein described the royalties are to go to grantor.

This conveyance is made by the grantor and accepted by the grantee and full compensation made therefor including all damages to crops and improvements under and by virtue of the general provisions of the Act of Congress approved February 28th 1902, entitled "an act to Grant the Right of Way through the Oklahoma Territory and the Indian Territory to the Great & Canadian Railway Company and for other purposes"

And in further consideration of the premises I do hereby acknowledge the receipt in full of all compensation and satisfaction for all property taken and damage done or to be done during the construction of said railroad over said land.
