

And in further consideration of the premises - do hereby acknowledge the receipt in full of all compensation and satisfaction for all property taken, and damage done or to be done during the construction of said railroad over said land.

And I, Lucy Charwee wife of Ekalanney Charwee the grantor hereby convey release and relinquish to the said grantee all my right of dower and homestead in and to said granted premises.
