Affiant further saith that the above Elva Owen Addie Owen, Albert Poage Owen and Olia Owen are the same identical persons named in the order of sale of the land herein described made by the Honorable Louis Sulzacker Judge of the United States Court for the Western District of Indian Territory sitting at Sapulpa December 8th 1905 probate case number 189; that they are the same identical persons who conveyed the above described lands by deeds recorded in Book 14 (Page 148, 151 and 208 all deeds, records at Sapulpa Indian Territory, and the guardian deed made by order of Court at Sapulpa Dated Dec^r 1906 conveying the interest of Addie Owens, Albert Poage Owens, and Olia Owens; that the name Owens is a mistake and should be Owen; that Owen is his correct name, and the correct name of his said children; that said minors have received all the proceeds of said sale by the said guardian for the said land herein described and make no further claim of title or right thereto, and that Elva Owen was born March 12th 1885.
