I Jonas Love being duly sworn depose and say that I am a Creek Indian and that I received an allotment deed to One Hundred and Twenty acres more or less of land described and situate as follows: west half of the south east quarter and the south-east quarter of the south east quarter of Section ten (10), township nineteen (19), north and Range Fourteen (14) east of the Indian base and meridian in Indian Territory. On this 15th day of November 1906 - - I gave my mother Mrs Kate L. Wallace full power of attorney to act for me in business transactions concerning any of my property because I was handicapped from doing so by the fact ^{that} was then, and am still confined in the U.S. Penitentiary at Leavenworth Kansas.

On the first day of July 1907 a Mr. Garfield Bull a lawyer from Indian Territory came to the Penitentiary and represented to me that he had seen my mother and that she had told him that any business transactions in regard to land belonging to me that I might complete with him would be satisfactory to her. He further said that for service that he proposed to render in the way of trying to get me released from the Penitentiary he wanted me to deed over to him eighty acres (80) of my land. On the representation made by him that he had seen my mother and that this was what she was satisfied I should do I signed the deed conveying to him the eighty (80) acres and I expressly told him that I did sign it on condition that my mother was satisfied.

On or about the 8th day of July 1907 said Mr. Bull came again to the penitentiary and made similar representations regarding the remaining forty (40) acres of my land and I not knowing that he had not see my mother and that his representations were not true I unwittingly signed said deed to said remaining forty acres of my land also.
