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To all to whom these Presents shall come greeting; -

Whereas, a townsite commission heretofore appointed and acting under authority of the act of Congress approved March 1, 1901 (21 Stat 861), agreement ratified by the Creek Nation May 25th 1901, has appraised the lots in the town of Tulsa Muskogee Creek Nation, Indian Territory; and Whereas, the plat of said town was approved by the Secretary of the Interior on the 11th day of April 1902 and was duly placed on file; and Whereas said commission has appraised all of the town lots included in said plat, at their true value excluding improvements which appraisal has been approved by the Secretary of the Interior Henry R. Allen and Louis M. Roe, Francis M. Kelley, Washington M. Wilson and Wyatt T. Brady, Trustees First Methodist Episcopal Church South of Tulsa I.T. who has paid sixty five \$65.00 Dollars, the full amount of the purchase price into the Treasury of the United States to the Credit of the Muskogee or Creek Nation of Indians with the United States Indian Agent, at Muskogee Indian Territory, and is therefore entitled to a patent.
