Willbanks her husband undertook to sell to David Plank and cl. W. Plank his wife lot five (5) in Block Eighty-seven (87) City of Tulsa, Creek Nation, Indian Territory, for the sum of Twenty-two ~~one~~ hundred, Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars of which sum Two ~~one~~ hundred (\$200.00) Dollars was to be paid in hand cash to the said Dora Willbanks to bind the bargain and for the purpose of clearing the title, and the balance Two Thous and Fifty (\$050.00) Dollars was to be paid to the said Dora Willbanks on the delivery to the said David Plank of a good merchantable abstract of title to said lot. Deponent further says that the said David Plank stated to him that the said sum of Two ~~one~~ hundred (\$200.00) Dollars was never paid by him the said David Plank or cl. W. Plank his wife, nor any part of it. Further deponent saith not.
