Burgess.

And it further appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that there has been allotted to John S. Burgess land in the Cherokee Nation described as follows to wit Lot Seven (7), and north one-half (N $\frac{1}{2}$) of south east one-fourth (S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$) and south east one-fourth (S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$); and north-east one-fourth (N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$) of south east one-fourth (S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$) Section thirty-five (35) Township twenty (20) north range twelve (12) east. that Nora B. Roth (nee Burgess) has conveyed all her right, title or interest in an undivided two-thirds interest in the above land to ^{Nora B. Roth} Carrie V. Gipson by quit claim deed.

And it further appearing to the satisfaction of the Court from the premises that all things are regular and in compliance with law the court appoints C. V. Robertson Jr., A. J. Rissinger and James H. Thomas as commissioners whose duty it shall be to view and inspect the land herein described and to measure it and to employ a competent surveyor to measure the same, and if after they have viewed and measured the same to report to this Court if a partition
