

applicable to the Creek tribe of Indians at the time of the death of the said Clarence Owen deceased that Chauncey A. Owen the father of Clarence Owen deceased, was the nearest relation to Clarence Owen deceased and as such nearest relation became the sole and only heir of the said Clarence Owen deceased and as such heir became the owner of the fee simple title to the above named tract of land.

And it appearing further that the said Chauncey A. Owen did on the 26th day of May 1906 make a good, valid and binding Warranty Deed to the said premises to the plaintiff herein thereby conveying to the plaintiff herein the fee simple and absolute title thereto.

Therefore, it is ordered, adjudged and decreed by this Court: that the plaintiff herein is found, and declared by this Court to have absolute title in fee simple to the premises referred to herein, and that the defendants have no right or title of any kind thereto. The title being in the plaintiff and no ground for partition existing the prayer of the plaintiff for partition is denied.
