Presents Shall Come
Greeting:

Whereas a townsite commission heretofore appointed and acting under the authority of the Act of Congress approved March 1, 1901, (31 Stat. 861) agreement ratified by the Creek Nation May 25, 1901, has appraised the lots in the town of Tulsa, Mustogee Creek Nation, Indian Territory and,

Further as, the plat of said town was approved by the Secretary of the Interior on the 11th day of April 1902 and was duly placed on file, and

Whereas, the said commission has appraised all of the town lots included in said plat at their true value including improvements, which appraisal has been approved by the Secretary of the Interior. And Whereas, the said commission has awarded the tract so described hereinbelow to Franklin R. Winters and Clarence O. Winterringer who has paid Fifty X ¹⁰⁰/₁₀₀ (\$500) dollars the full amount of the purchase price into the Treasury of the United States, to the credit of the Mustogee or Creek Nation of Indians with the United States Indian Agent at Mustogee, Indian Territory, and is therefore, entitled to a patent:

Now Therefore, I, the undersigned, the Principal Chief of the Mustogee Creek Nation, do, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the aforesaid Act of the Congress of the United States hereby grant, sell and convey unto said Franklin R. Winters and Clarence O. Winterringer heirs and assigns forever, all the right, title and interest of the Mustogee (Creek) Nation aforesaid in and to Lot numbered 4 in Block numbered 75 in the town of Tulsa Mustogee (Creek) Nation Indian Territory and according to the plat thereof on file as aforesaid.

In Witness Whereof I, the Principal Chief of the Mustogee (Creek) Nation have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of said Nation to be
