

This Indenture, Made this 28th day of December A. D. 1907, between
Arthur L. Murphy and Ruth R. Murphy his wife,
 of the City of Homestead, Missouri in the Wilbur C. Campbell District of the Indian Territory, part 100 of the first part, and
 of Tulsa, Ind. Ter. part 7 of the second part,

WITNESSETH, That whereas the said part 100 of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of
One hundred 00/100 (\$100.00) DOLLARS,
 to them in hand paid by said Wilbur C. Campbell, party of the second part
 the receipt whereof is hereby duly acknowledged, have sold, and by these presents do hereby Give, Grant, Bargain, Sell, Convey and
 Confirm unto the said part 7 of the second part, The heirs and assigns, in fee simple, forever, all that tract or parcel of land, situated
 in the Town of Tulsa Creek Nation, Western District of the
 Indian Territory, according to the United States Survey and official plat thereof, as made by the Government
 Townsite Commission, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior of the United States, bound and described as follows, to-wit:

All of lot number 116 in block number one hundred, and half (1/2) as shown
 by the Government plat of said town of Tulsa, Ind. Ter. (It is understood that this deed
 is made to correct one certain deed dated the second day of August nineteen hundred and
 two conveying title to the above described premises from said party of the first part
 to said party of the second part.)

Together with all and singular the privileges, improvements, tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in
 anywise appertaining, with all the estate, title and interest of said part 100 of the first part therein.

The said part 100 grantor hereby covenants with the said part 7 grantees that They are the lawful owner S. of the said parcel
 or tract of land; that the title thereof is in them; that They are seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance
 therein, and have a lawful right to sell and convey the same; that there are no liens or mortgages on said property of any kind or
 nature whatsoever. With the exception of the Government appraisement which second party assumes, and agrees to pay.

And the said part 100 of the first part hereby covenants and agrees with the said part 7 of the second part, that They will, and
their heirs, executors and administrators shall, forever warrant and defend the title to the said lands against all lawful and
 equitable claims and demands whatsoever.

And I, Ruth R. Murphy wife of the said Arthur L. Murphy
 for and in consideration of the said sum of money, and for divers and other good and valuable considerations, do hereby release, relinquish
 and quit-claim unto the said Wilbur C. Campbell heirs and assigns, all my rights, claim
 or dower, and my homestead or possibility of dower or homestead, in and to the aforescribed premises.
