

This Indenture, Made this 15th day of June, A. D. 1903, between

 of Red Fork, Ind. Terr. part 2 of the second part,

WITNESSETH, That whereas the said part 2 of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of fifty & no/100 (\$50) DOLLARS,
 to me in hand paid by said James Mackin
 the receipt whereof is hereby duly acknowledged, he has sold, and by these presents do hereby Give, Grant, Bargain, Sell, Convey and
 Confirm unto the said part 2 of the second part, h heirs and assigns, in fee simple, forever, all that tract or parcel of land, situated
 in the Town of Red Fork, Ind. Terr. Nation, Indian Territory District of the
 Indian Territory, according to the United States Survey and official plat thereof, as made by the
 Townsite Commission, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior of the United States, bound and described as follows, to-wit:

all of lot (6) in block (17) seventeen in the incorporated town of
Red Fork, Indian Territory

Together with all and singular the privileges, improvements, tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in
 anywise appertaining, with all the estate, title and interest of said part 2 of the first part therein.

The said part 2 grantor hereby covenants with the said part 2 grantee that he is the lawful owner of the said parcel
 or tract of land; that the title thereof is in fact; that he is seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance
 therein, and has a lawful right to sell and convey the same; that there are no liens or mortgages on said property of any kind or
 nature whatsoever.

And the said part 2 of the first part hereby covenants and agrees with the said part 2 of the second part, that he will, and
his heirs, executors and administrators shall, forever warrant and defend the title to the said lands against all lawful and
 equitable claims and demands whatsoever.

 and quit-claim unto the said James Mackin heirs and assigns, all my rights, claim
