## WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we Mary Turley and James W. Turley, her husband  
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and Twenty five DOLLARS,  
 to us in hand paid by Thomas W. Lowe, the receipt whereof  
 is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant,  
 bargain, sell and convey unto said Thomas W. Lowe and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following  
 lands lying in the Cherokee Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit:  
Lot Five (5) in Block Four (4) in Survey Addition to the City of  
Tulsa, as shown by the plat of said Addition filed for record  
at Sapulpa in the Eighth Recording District.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Thomas W. Lowe and unto his heirs and as-  
 signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Thomas W. Lowe that we will forever warrant and defend the  
 title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, James W. Turley, husband of the said Mary Turley for and in consideration of the said sum of  
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Thomas W. Lowe all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
