WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

To us in hand paid by P. E. Coyne, the receipt of the same being
herby acknowledged. we do hereby grant,

bargain, sell and convey unto said P. E. Coyne and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following
 lands lying in the Town of Tulsa Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit:

 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said P. E. Coyne all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
