Do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said International Land Company's successors and unto their heirs and assigns forever, the following described lot or parcel of ground lying and being situate in the Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit:

to wit: The south-west quarter of the north-west quarter of the
north-east quarter and the east half of the south-west quarter of the
north-east quarter and the east half of the north-east quarter of the
south-west quarter of the north-west quarter of section Twenty
apart 13, township 36 north, range 19 west, T2S, R19W, E2S, being
the allotment of Wiley Cooky may be conveyed further.

To have and to hold the same unto the said International Land Company and unto their heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant, sell, with said International Land Company that said lands are
