KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we, Charles H. Patton and Cora M. Patton
his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Seventy and no DOLLARS,
to them in hand paid by John Hodson the
receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, they do hereby grant,
bargain, sell and convey unto said John Hodson and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following
lands lying in the Town of Bigby Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit:

all of lot numbered twenty four (24) in Block numbered
twenty four (24) in the original townsite of
Bigby Creek Nation Indian Territory according
to plat on file of said town of Bigby

To have and to hold the same unto the said John Hodson and unto his heirs and as-
signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said John Hodson and that we will forever warrant and defend the
title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Cora Patton, wife of the said Charles H. Patton for and in consideration of the said sum of
money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said John Hodson all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
