WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we Adesta Berry and an unmarried woman
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Six Thousand Two Hundred thirty DOLLARS,
 (\$6230.00) the receipt whereof is acknowledged from
the Union Construction Company of Tulsa, Indian Territory
 do hereby grant,
 bargain, sell and convey unto said Union Construction Company and its successors
 and unto its heirs and assigns forever, the following

lands lying in the Creek nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit:

All that part and parcel of Lot eight 8 and the
SE quarter 1/4 of the SW quarter 1/4 of section eight 8
township nineteen (19) N. Range twelve (12) E. lying and
being south of the Right of way of the Arkansas Valley
Western Railroad as now located thereon, containing
1/4 acre more or less
 To have and to hold the same unto the said Union Construction Company and its successors
 and unto its heirs and as-

signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Union Construction Company that she will forever warrant and defend the
 title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Adesta Berry, wife of the said Union Construction Company for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Union Construction Company all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
