WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we, Jonas Love and Annie Love
 of Bequa nation Indian Territory
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar of her valuable consideration
 to be paid by J. Garfield Buell receipt of which
 is here by acknowledged do hereby grant,

bargain, sell and convey unto said J. Garfield Buell and his heirs and assigns forever, the following
 described lot or parcel of ground lying and being situate in
 lands lying in the Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit:

The Western District Creek nation, the Indian Territory
township west half 1/2 of southeast quarter (1/4)
and southeast quarter (1/4) of southeast quarter (1/4) of
Section ten (10) Township nineteen (19) north range
fourteen (14) east

To have and to hold the same unto the said J. Garfield Buell and unto his heirs and as-
 signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said J. Garfield Buell that said lands are free from incumbrances
 title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Annie Love, wife of the said Jonas Love for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said J. Garfield Buell all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
