WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS,

That we Robert B. Williamson and (a single man)
 his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Fourteen hundred & Fifty (\$1450.00) DOLLARS,
 in hand paid by Vaughney & Moloney, the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant,

bargain, sell and convey unto said Vaughney & Moloney and unto their heirs and assigns forever, the following
 lands lying in the Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit: That part of Lot No. Five (5)
in Block No. One Hundred and Sixty (160) of the original town of Tulsa, Indian
territory, described as follows: Beginning at the North westerly corner
said Lot No. Five (5) in Block No. One Hundred and Sixty (160), and running
in a North easterly direction a distance of 140 feet to the alley line of said
Block, thence running in a North westerly direction a distance of 50 feet
along said alley line, thence in a South westerly direction a distance of 140 feet
on an imaginary line parallel to the lot line between lots 4 & 5, thence
in a South easterly direction a distance of 50 feet to the place of beginning
said lot having a frontage of 50 feet on South Denver Avenue, and
a uniform depth of 140 feet to the alley

To have and to hold the same unto the said Vaughney & Moloney and unto their heirs and as-
 signs forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant S. with said Vaughney & Moloney that I will forever warrant and defend the
 title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, wife of the said Robert B. Williamson for and in consideration of the said sum of
 money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Vaughney & Moloney all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
