WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we Melana Elizabeth Hark and John Hark (her husband) his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of One thousand and fifty (\$1050) DOLLARS, cash in hand paid the receipt of which of herby acknowledged do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said George T. Bacastow and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the city of Tulsa Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit:

the west one half (1/2) of lot six in block one hundred and twenty six (126) in the city of Tulsa, Indian Territory, being seventy by one hundred feet, according to the record and plat thereof

To have and to hold the same unto the said George T. Bacastow and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said George T. Bacastow that they will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, John Hark husband, wife of the said Melana Elizabeth Hark for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said George T. Bacastow all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
