WARRANTY DEED

WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS.

That we, Willie Moore and George W. Adams, a creek Freedman, past 21 years of age, single men, my mother is dead of Andrew Robert Moore, I have no other heirs, his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Five DOLLARS,

and other good and valuable considerations the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said George W. Adams and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following

lands lying in the Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit:

The north east 1/4 quarter of the north east 1/4 quarter of Section Twenty (20) three Township (19) nineteen north range (11) eleven east.

Containing 40 acres more or less according to the Government Survey

To have and to hold the same unto the said George W. Adams and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said George W. Adams that I will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Willie Moore, wife of the said George W. Adams for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said George W. Adams all rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
