Quit Claim Deed

This indenture made this 25th day of June, 1906, between the City of Tulsa, Indian Territory, party of the first part, and G. W. Robertson, Jr. party of the second part witnesseth:

That for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) to it duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said party of the first part has remised, released, conveyed and quit-claimed, and by these presents does quit-claim unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns forever, all its right, title and interest both at law and equity, in and to the following described property, to-wit:

The East forty (40) feet of Lot No. Six (6) in Block No. Nine (9) in the City of Tulsa, Indian Territory, as shown by the official plat thereof.

To have and to hold the said described premises, together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, unto the said G. W. Robertson Jr., his heirs and assigns, forever.

In witness whereof, the said party of the first part has caused these presents to be signed in its name by its Mayor, and its corporate seal to be affixed, attested by its Recorder at Tulsa, this day and year first above written.
