Warranty Deed with relinquishment of dower.

Know All Men By These Presents: That we John D. Seaman and Hadasa J. Seaman his wife for and in consideration of the sum of Forty five hundred & 00/100 Dollars in hand paid by C. E. Davis, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto C. E. Davis and unto his heirs and assigns forever the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit: That part of Lot No. Two (2) in Block No. One hundred forty eight (148) of the town of Tulsa, I. T., according to the Official Plat and Survey thereof, having a frontage of Seventy-five (75) feet on South Main Street and a depth of One Hundred forty (140) feet to the Alley line rear, with a uniform width of Seventy-five (75) feet, lying parallel and adjacent to South Sixth Street.

To have and to hold the same unto the said C. E. Davis and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said C. E. Davis that we will forever warrant and defend the title to said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Hadasa J. Seaman, wife of the said John D. Seaman, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said C. E. Davis all my rights of dower and homestead in and to said lands.
