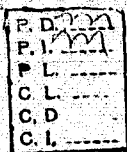

Warranty deed with relinquishment of dower.

Know All Men By These Presents:

That we C. B. Lynch and Jay Forsythe and C. J. Lynch and Jennie Forsythe their wives for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred & twenty five dollars, the receipt in full of which is hereby acknowledged do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said L. J. and G. W. Allen and unto their heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to wit:

Lot Fourteen (14) Block Eighteen (18) Lynch & Forsythe's Addition to Tulsa Land Sec.

To have and to hold the same unto the said L. J. and G. W. Allen and unto their heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereto belonging.

And hereby covenants with said L. J. and G. W. Allen that they will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, C. J. Lynch wife of the said C. B. Lynch and I, Jennie Forsythe wife of the said Jay Forsythe for and in consideration of the said sum of money do hereby release and relinquish unto the said L. J. and G. W. Allen all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
