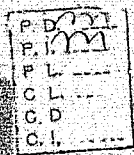

Warranty deed with relinquishment of dower.

Jeff Potter,

Known all men by these presents:

That We, S. K. Williams and Bessie L. Williams his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve ⁵⁰/₁₀₀ Dollars, to us paid by Jeff Potter do hereby grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Jeff Potter and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the N E 1/4 of the NW 1/4 and the West half (shower) on the U. S. Survey as lots 1 & 2 of the NW 1/4 of Sec. 34, T. 19 N and Range 14 E, Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory to wit: Lot 16 No. sixteen Block 18 No. Eighteen in Valley, D. T.

To have and to hold the same unto the said Jeff Potter and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereto belonging.

And we hereby covenant with said Jeff Potter that we will forever warrant and defend the title to the said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Bessie L. Williams, wife of the said S. K. Williams, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Jeff Potter all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
