Warranty Deed with relinquishment of dower.

James Carnahan,

Know All Men by These Presents:

That We, S. K. Williams and Bessie L. Williams, his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve ⁵⁰/₁₀₀ dollars, to us paid by James Carnahan, do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said James Carnahan and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the N⁶/₄ of the NW ¹/₄ and the West half (shown on the U.S. Survey as lots 172) of the NW ¹/₄ of Sec. 31, T19N and Range 14E, Creek Nation, Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: Lot 19 No. Nineteen Block 15 No. Fifteen in Valley, D.T.

To have and to hold the same unto the said James Carnahan and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all appurtenances thereto belonging.

And we hereby covenant with said James Carnahan that we will forever warrant and defend the title to the said lands against all claims whatsoever.

And I, Bessie L. Williams, wife of the said S. K. Williams, for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said James Carnahan all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
