At this 11th day of August, 1906, the undersigned J. W. Gillette and L. W. Willits, being duly sworn to before me and say that they are well acquainted with Mayme Sullivan, a black citizen, that from our own personal knowledge and acquaintance with the said Mayme Sullivan and the matter hereinafter set forth we know that the person named in the proceedings in the United States Court at Sapulpa, Indian Territory, in Equity (Case No. 156) wherein Mayme Sullivan was named as receiving a portion of land in the partition of the Estate of George B. Perryman, deceased, except in the decree of the Court wherein her name is given as Maime Sullivan, in describing the portion of land set apart to her, and that in the letter of transmittal from the Department of Interior to the Commissioner to the Two Civilized Tribes at Muskogee, Indian Territory dated May 19, 1906, wherein the Department of the Interior grants petition to applicant named as Maime Sullivan to unconditionally alienate for townsite purposes certain inherited lands, the land in each case being as follows to wit: The North East quarter of the South West quarter of the North West quarter (N.E. 1-1 of S.W. 1-4 of the N.W. 1-4) Section 12, Township 19 North, Range 12 East, that the person named as Maime Sullivan and Maime Sullivan are of record and Mayme Sullivan are one and the same person. And further deponents say nothing more.
