Harry Hensley,

This Indenture made the 25th day of June, 1906, between Savoy Oil Company, a New Jersey corporation, party of the first part, and Harry Hensley of Pittsburgh, Pa., party of the second part, Witnesses, settle:

That said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable considerations to it paid by the party of the second part, at or before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, aliened, remised, released, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, alien, remise, release, convey and confirm unto said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, all its right, title and interest of every kind, name and nature in, to, and in relation to, a certain oil and gas lease dated the 5th day of June, 1905, and expiring on June 4th, 1920, of forty (40) acres, being the Northwest quarter (N.W. 1/4) of the Southwest quarter (S.W. 1/4) of Section 20, Township 20, Range 13 in the Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, taken by said party of the second part in his own name, as lessee, from Albert L. Loyd, as lessor, together with all the issues, rents and profits thereof.

To Have And To Hold the same unto the party of the second part, heirs and assigns forever;

And said party of the first part for itself, its successors and assigns does hereby covenant, promise and agree to and with said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, that it has not made, done, committed, executed, suffered, suffered or done, thing or things whatsoever whereby or by means whereof said right, title and interest hereby conveyed to said party of the second part, or any part thereof, are, or at any time hereafter shall or may be impeached, charged or incumbered in any manner or way whatsoever.
