United States of America, Indian Territory, Western Judicial District,

I, Sarhoscher, being first duly sworn and on my oath, state that I am well acquainted with Mollie Hajo, wife of Albert Hajo, who is now living near Okemah, Indian Territory. The said Mollie Hajo's maiden name was Mollie Runt. Her mother's name was Leetcher. Leetcher is deceased, having died several years ago near Hamul, Indian Territory. Leetcher was a full blood Indian and a Creek citizen and Mollie Hajo is a full blood Indian and a Creek citizen. I have known Leetcher a long time and I know that Leetcher was the mother of the said Mollie Hajo (nee Mollie Runt). Leetcher had three other children, besides the said Mollie Hajo, all of whom are deceased. Two of the three died in infancy and the other one of said three died when it was very small and when it was just learning to walk. All three died so young that not one of them had ever been named. Neither of the three was ever married and had no offspring. Mollie Hajo and the three other children hereinbefore mentioned are the only children that Leetcher ever had.

I have known Leetcher and her Husband for many years. Her husband's name was Kothotchie Kochohnie. He is now deceased. He died several years ago. He died before Leetcher died. Kothotchie Kochohnie and the three deceased children mentioned above, all died near Hamul, Indian Territory. I know that the said Mollie Hajo is the only living child of Leetcher.
