Warranty Deed.

Know all Men by these Presents, that I David Smith a single man of Tulsa, Indian Territory for and in consideration of One thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto R. S. Waddell of Tulsa, Indian Territory and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following lands lying in the Northern District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: South-West quarter (S.W. 1/4) of South-East quarter (S.E. 1/4) and North-West quarter (N.W. 1/4) of South-East quarter (S.E. 1/4) of South-East quarter (S.E. 1/4) of Section Two (2), Township Twenty-one (21) North, Range Twelve (12) East. The same being my allotment in the Cherokee Nation under Freedman Roll # 39713

To have and to hold the same unto the said R. S. Waddell and unto his heirs and assigns forever, with all and appurtenances thereto belonging.

And hereby covenants with said R. S. Waddell that I will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all persons claiming by, through, in or under me.
