W. Muratet, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, does hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto G. W. Muratet, all the following described parcel of land situate in the town of Broken Arrow, Creek Nation, Indian Territory, said parcel of land being known and designated upon the townsite plat of said town as: Lot number 7-829 Block number 13.

To Have and to Hold the aforegranted premises unto the said G. W. Muratet, and his heirs in fee simple forever, and the said Arkansas Valley Townsite Company, for itself, its successors and assigns, covenants with the said G. W. Muratet, and his heirs and assigns that it is lawfully seized in fee of the aforegranted premises, and that the same are free from all encumbrances; that it has a good right to sell and convey the same to said G. W. Muratet, as aforesaid; and that it will, and its successors shall warrant and defend the same to the said G. W. Muratet, and his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons.
