

The parties of the first part shall have the right and privilege of using, at their own risk, sufficient gas for one dwelling house from any gas well found on and described premises, they to make their own connections at said wells.

It is agreed that the party of the second part shall have the privilege of using sufficient water from the premises to run all necessary machinery, and at any time to remove all machinery and fixtures placed on said premises; and further, for the payment of one dollar, at any time thereafter by the party of the second part, its successors or assigns, or by deposit of said sum together with all amounts due hereunder in the Citizens Nat. Bank of Okmulgee, the said party of the second, its successors or assigns, shall have the right to surrender this lease for cancellation, and delivery of said lease to the party of the first part in person or a deposit of the same with the money in the said bank as aforesaid shall operate as a complete surrender of all of the interests of the said party of the second part, its successors or assigns, in the said property, after which all payments and liabilities thereafter to accrue, under and by virtue of its terms, shall cease and determine and this lease shall become absolutely null and void.
