J. D. Seaman being duly sworn deposes and says that he is well acquainted with the following described real estate to-wit:

All of the South seventy-five (75) feet of Lot Five (5) in Block One hundred forty-eight (148) situate in the town of Tulsa, Western District, Indian Territory,

and he is well acquainted and knows every person who ever had any interest in the same prior to the time he obtained a patent to the same from the Principal Chief of the Creek Nation, Indian Territory dated July 5th 1905 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior August 21-1905; That the first person who ever had any interest in said land in any shape was George Perryman, an Indian citizen of the Creek Nation who settled upon and occupied a tract of land of which this is a portion as a residence and made some improvements thereon which gave him the right to control, possess and use the same against all the world until the same was platted, sold and patented to this affiant according to law. That subsequently the said George Perryman sold all his interest in said above described tract of land to Mrs. O. B. Boone including his right to possess and use the same, and she in turn subsequently sold the same tract of land to J. H. Deitz and A. W. Bright and they in turn delivered up the possession of said real estate by selling all their interest in said tract including whatsoever right they had to possess and use the same to one Vinton Smith and delivered up the possession of said tract to said Vinton Smith.

That on the 21st day of May A. D. 1901 the said Vinton Smith sold all his right and interest in said real estate including the right to use and possess the same to this affiant and delivered up the possession to the said land to this affiant, and the affiant deposes and says that he knows of his own knowledge that no other person or persons ever had any interest in the said land or had possession of the same or made any improvements thereon or exercised any control on the same in any manner whatsoever. Further the affiant sayeth not.
