General Quarry Deeds

This Deed, made and entered into this 1st day of July in the ninth hundred and seven by and between Elly Bell, and Elly Bell her wife of Elkhorn, A. T. part of the first part, and A. H. Quarry, of Butte, and Ben. J. part of the second part.

Witnesseth, that the said part of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of \$1000, the said Ben. J. and A. H. Quarry, on hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have hereby granted, bargained, sold, conveyed and confirmed unto the said party of the second part and unto the heirs and assigns, executors and administrators in the mortgages or Greek nation, and within the limits of the Indian Territory, to-wit: the west half of the north half quarter and the north east quarter of the north half quarter of Section Twenty-four (24) Township Twenty (20) North, and Range Twelfth (12) East, with all

pertaining and thereunto belonging.

As there and to hold the same unto the said A. H. Quarry, the heirs and assigns, executors and administrators forever, and the said Elly Bell and Elly Bell her wife for themselves - heirs and assigns, the heirs and assigns, executors and administrators that they or their heirs and assigns, executors and administrators that they or their heirs and assigns, executors and administrators of the foregoing premises, that they are hereby lawfully seized in fee simple of the foregoing premises, that they are free from all incumbrances, except - that they have agreed and lawful right to sell and convey the same as herein done; that they well and their heirs and assigns, executors and administrators shall forever warrant and defend the title to the same to the great injury man, of said A. H. Quarry, his heirs and assigns, executors and administrators, against all unjust claims and demands of all persons whatsoever.

And A. H. Quarry Bell wife of Elly Bell, the grantor herein, do hereby join in this conveyance, and for the consideration for-ward, no convey, release, relinquish and renounce forever, all my right, claim and possibility of power and domination in and to said property.
