E. C. Gilman

Know ye all men by these Presents, That We, Wiley Grayson, and — a citizen of the Creek Nation, and a resident of Kingston, Oklahoma, for and in consideration of the sum of \$1.00 and other good and valuable considerations to me paid by the E. C. Gilman, of Muskogee, Indian Territory, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, so hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said E. C. Gilman, his heirs and assigns forever, the following described lot or parcel of land, lying and being situate in the Creek Nation in Indian Territory, to-wit: The south half of the south-west quarter of Section Three (3), and the north half of the north-west quarter of Section Ten (10), Township nineteen (19) north and Range Ten (10) East;

To Have To Hold the aforementioned Premises unto the said E. C. Gilman, his heirs and assigns in fee simple forever, with all appurtenances thereto belonging, and we, Wiley Grayson and heirs and assigns, hereby covenants with the said E. C. Gilman, that said lands are free from all incumbrances, and that we, our successors and assigns will forever warrant and defend the title to said lands against all lawful claims whatever.

And —, wife of the said Wiley Grayson, for the consideration aforementioned, do hereby release unto the said E. C. Gilman all my right of Dower and Homestead in and to said lands.
