

Agreement, G. H. H. "A"

Whereas, Amos Steelsmith, of Caney, Kansas, is justly indebted to the William Havanough Company, a corporation, of Norwalk, Ohio, in the sum of approximately \$2,500.00 now evidenced by certain promissory notes and items of open account, and

Whereas, the said Amos Steelsmith desires to secure the William Havanough Company for such indebtedness now owing or for any indebtedness that he may hereafter owe said Company up to said sum of \$2,500. It is agreed as follows:

That he is to execute and deliver to said William Havanough Company, a chattel mortgage on two drilling rigs now at work in what is known as the "Glenn Pool Field", in the Indian Territory, together with all the tools, appliances and appurtenances connected therewith.

It is agreed that the said Amos Steelsmith shall pay the aforesaid indebtedness as speedily as possible according to the terms of his notes and the provisions of the account and that he will apply on said indebtedness from time to time the sum of not less than \$150.00 on each well drilled after the two first wells have been drilled by the rigs above referred to in the Glenn Field.

Said Amos Steelsmith now having a contract with one, G. W. Barber, for the drilling of 12 to 15 wells in the Glenn Field.

It is agreed by the said Steelsmith that in the event he shall fail to pay said sum of \$150.00 from each well drilled by the rigs above mentioned in the Glenn Pool after the first two wells, then and in that event, the entire amount of his indebtedness shall at once become due and payable and the conditions of said chattel mortgage shall become absolute and the William Havanough Company shall have the right to take possession of, sell and dispose of the mortgaged property in the manner provided by law and as per the terms of the mortgage here-to attached.
