The said Guy Bowman is authorized and directed to convey the property of aforesaid deed to the beneficiaries herein mentioned. They shall take the same free from any trust herein created.

and for the consideration of aforesaid, I, Nolie B. Fears, wife of the said W. S. Fears do hereby relinquish and quit claim unto the said Guy Bowman his executors and assigns all my right, claim or possibility of dower in or out of the aforesaid granted premises,
