Sented Contract.

These indentures made this 25th day of January, 1905 -
by and between Henry M. Engle and of Benton, Indian
Territory, party of the first part and J. Benton, of
Edmondville, 1st J. party of the second part.

Witnesseth: That the said party of the first part
for the consideration herein after named, does hereby
lease grant, demise and let unto the said party of the
second part all that parcel and tract of land for the term
of five (5) years said term to commence on the 25th day of
January 1905, and expiring on the 24 day of January 1910,
situated in the Cherokee Nation and more particularly
described as the - land, 160 1/4 of the 30th of section
28 7 1/2 of the 2nd E. 1/4 of the 30th of section 28 in town
ship 22 Range 14, 10th and in consideration of the sum
of Two Hundred (200) Dollars to him in hand paid by
the said party of the second part the receipt of which
is hereby acknowledged, and the further consideration that the
said part of the second does hereby agree to farm the
above described premises in a good and workmanlike
manner and leave the same in the quiet and peaceable
possession of the party - first part at the expiration of the
contract.
