Quit-claim Deed.

Know all men by these presents that Mary Berry Hill and John Berry Hill, her husband, of the County of Clark, State of Missouri, for and in consideration of the sum of eight hundred and fifty five Dollars in hand paid by Thomas J. Berry Hill, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby sever, release, convey and quit claim unto the said Thomas J. Berry Hill, and unto his heirs and assigns forever, the following described property, situated in the Creek Section, Indian Territory, to-wit:

All and undivided interest in and to the south half of the south west quarter and the West One fourth of the south west quarter of the north east quarter (less 10 acres occupied by the Arkansas Valley & Western Railroad) and lots 5, 6, 7 and 8, West 10 acres of Lot 8, all in Section 14, Township 19, North, Range 11, East containing 160.42 acres, and lying all the allotment of Littleton Berry Hill, deceased.

To have and to hold the same unto said second party, his heirs and assigns forever, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And I, Mary Berry Hill, in consideration of said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Thomas J. Berry Hill, all my right of Dower and Homestead in and to the said land.
