St. Louis, Mo., October, 16, 1907.

Five months after date, for value received, C. D. Webster Refining Company of Tulsa, Indian Territory, promises to pay to Walter A. Gelmick Supply Company, or order, One Hundred and Seven Dollars and Twenty Cents (\$107.20), with interest from date at the rate of seven percent (7%) per annum, at the Farmers National Bank of Tulsa, Indian Territory.

This note is one of a series of five notes of like tenor and date, due in one, two, three, four and five months after date respectively, given as part payment for:-

One standard gauge five thousand and eighty (5080) gallon tank car, sixty thousand (60,000) pounds capacity, originally Cudahy Oil Tank Line car #13, now lettered and known as C. D. Webster Refining Company car #201, sold us by the payee, and to be used by us in connection with our oil refinery at Tulsa, Indian Territory.

It is agreed and understood that the above described car is to be kept in good repair, and in condition to pass M.C. R. rules of interchange at all junction points entirely at our expense, and that all mileage and other earnings thereof shall accrue to us during the life of this contract, but that the title to said property is to remain in the payee or its assignee, and whatever equity we may be entitled to in same by virtue of any payments thereon, is hereby pledged to the said payee or its assignee, and held by us as its trustee until all of said notes shall have been fully paid, in the event that any of said notes shall not be paid at maturity, such non-payment shall serve to render due, all unmatured notes of the series, and the payee or its assignee may, without further notice to us, and without any liability whatsoever, for trespass, take possession of said property for their own benefit.

The maker and endorser hereof, each and severally, waive presentation for payment, notice of non-payment, and notice of protest of this note, and agree that should it become necessary to place same in the hands of an attorney for collection, that they will pay all attorney's fees for such action, ten percent (10%) of the face of the note.
