This agreement made this 29th day of August, 1907, by and between
Henry A. Elliott of Bartlesville, Ind. Ter., party of the first part, and
James D. Ward of Cushingville, Ind. Ter., party of the second, part, is to
the effect that the party of first part is this day and by this
agreement does lease to party of second part, the following de-
scribed land, - SAW of NE84, and NW4 of SE84 of 804, sec. 10, two, six in
section five, Township twenty-one, range fifteen, in the Cherokee
Nation, Indian Territory for the sum of one hundred twelve, \$112
Dollars, of which amount the sum of Fifty Dollars has theretofore
been paid to party of first part by party of second part, the receipt
of which the party of the first part hereby acknowledges, for all
and less purposes for a period of fifteen years, according to
Government rules and regulations, the balance of the purchase
money to be paid to party of first part on the making by him to party
of second of act of the Government lease on this land, and the party
of the first part to make said lease at request of party of second
part. The party of first part hereby states that he has good right
to lease the above land, that he had not executed any former lease
that will interfere with this agreed on lease.
