That the Tulsa Gas Company, a corporation organized under the laws in force in Indian Territory, for and in consideration of the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar to it paid, by Annie B. Orcutt, do hereby grant, quit claim, lease and re-lease unto the said Annie B. Orcutt and unto her heirs and assigns forever, all their rights, title and interest, in and to an Oil and Gas Mining Lease upon the following described property, to-wit: a piece of land, described as follows:

Beginning in the NE corner of the NW Quarter (4) of the S.E. Quarter (4) of Section Seven (7), Township Nineteen (19) North, Range Thirteen (13) East; thence due N. 952 ft.; thence due S 458 ft. and 8 inches; thence E 952 ft.; thence N 458 ft. and 8 inches to the point of beginning, consisting of ten (10) acres.

This release being a release to an oil and gas mining lease dated Feb 17, 1906, and Recorded Sapulpa, D. T. in Book 12 and page 615, of the records of the Eighth Recording District of the Indian Territory by Annie B.
