Deed of Release

I know all men by these presents:

That I Sallie E. Gray, in consideration of the value received do hereby acknowledge full payment and complete satisfaction of a certain mortgage given by S. E. Wilder and L. L. Wilder her husband to Sallie E. Gray for the amount of Five Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$500) dated the 7th day of December 1906 and filed for record the 7th day of December 1906, and recorded in Book Three page one hundred and nine, in the office of the United States Clerk at Tulsa Eastern District Indian Territory, the property hereby released and discharged from said mortgage being as follows:

A part of Lot one, Block four north Tulsa Indian Territory according to the plat of the aforesaid north Tulsa.

Beginning at the south west corner of said Lot one thence east along said line one hundred and one ^{and} one tenth (101.1) thence at right angles to said south line north forty and five hundredths feet 40.05, thence at right angle west one hundred and one and one tenth feet (101.1) to the line between said Lot one and north Cheyenne street, thence at right angles south along said street line forty and five hundredths feet to the point of beginning ~~making a plot of ground forty and five hundredths feet~~ ~~to the point of beginning making a plot of~~ ground forty and five hundredths feet 40.05 by one hundred and one and one tenth (101.1) feet.
